# **BALANCED HANDS**

# <u>OPENING</u> **1NT** <u>12-14 PTS</u>

### THIS IS OUR FIRST BID (ON THE CHART) FOR ALL BALANCED HANDS.

We shall be going down this chart <u>STAGE BY STAGE - PAGE BY PAGE</u>, until we reach 25+ pts!!! Phew!!!

This is our very first stage and introduction to the bidding.

You either have a BALANCED or UNBALANCED hand.

So let's make a start at the beginning.

When you have finished adding your points and find you have 12+, you can open the bidding, but only when it's your turn.

## Are you Balanced or Unbalanced?

What is a Balanced hand? No singleton

No Void

No more than one doubleton.

**SHAPE** Balanced <u>4-4-3-2</u>, <u>4-3-3-3</u>, Semi- Balanced <u>5-3-3-2</u>

5-3-3-2 hands? If the 5 card suit is a major, it's usually best to open and rebid the suit. If the 5 card suit is a minor, it's best to open 1NT.
